IMPACT OF NONPROFITS IN LINCOLN

We collected data from a sample of nonprofits in Lincoln to show the economic and social impact they have on our community.

2420

The number of **people employed** by nonprofits of the 60 agencies surveyed in Lincoln. There are over 600 nonprofits in Lincoln alone.

3059

The average number of **people nonprofits serve** in Lincoln each year, per agency. (based on the 60 survey participants).

3,145,938

The number of **encounters provided to the Lincoln community** of they survey participants. An encounter is every time a nonprofit has contact with a person and provides them with assistance. (e.g., each time the Food Bank gives a food package to someone)

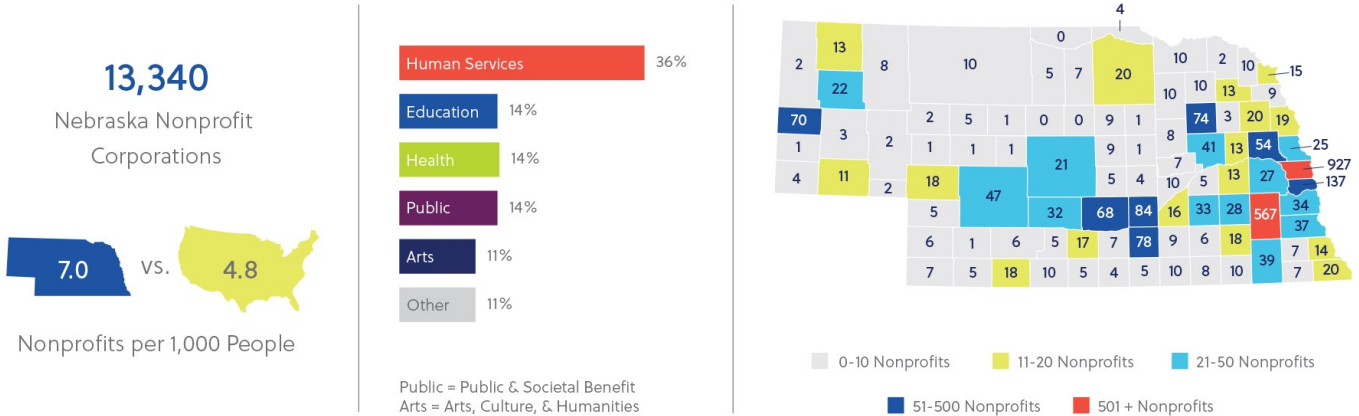

NONPROFIT ECONOMIC IMPACT

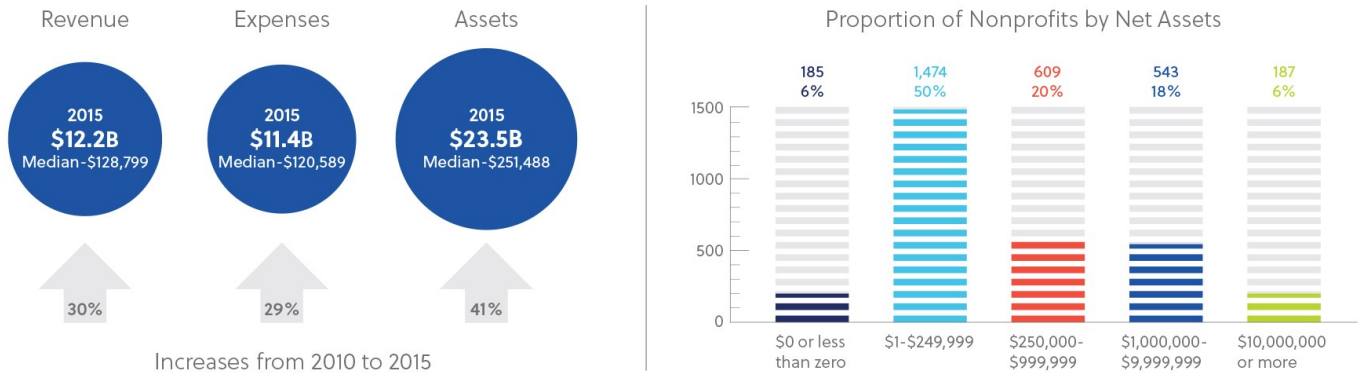
1 The nonprofit bottom line is a better community

There are more nonprofits per 1,000 people in Nebraska than in the United States. Most are human service focused and located in larger counties across the state.



2 Nonprofits have an economic ripple effect on Nebraska

Nonprofit revenue, expenses, and assets have all increased over time. However, the majority (56%) of nonprofits are still operating with less than \$250,000 in net assets.



3 Nonprofits create mission-driven jobs for Nebraskans

Nonprofits employed 90,000+ people (1 in 11) and paid \$3.9B in wages in 2015, up 20% from 2010. Nonprofit median wages were higher than for-profit and government.
